VISION STATEMENT

The City of London Freeman's School is an independent co-educational day and boarding school which provides continuity of education for children aged 7 to 18.

The School was founded in Brixton in 1854 by the Corporation of the City of London to provide 'a religious and virtuous education' for the orphaned children of Freeman of the City of London; christian principles remain at the heart of its ethos, although the School is non-denominational.

In 1926 the School moved to Ashted Park, its present site and now educates approximately 860 girls and boys, from age 7-13 (Junior School) and from age 13-18 (Senior School). Most of these pupils are day pupils, but the School remains firmly committed to the provision of boarding for a number of its pupils.

The City of London Freeman's School is one of three independent schools owned by the City of London Corporation. There are strong links between the schools and both the Corporation and the City Livery Companies.

The School remains committed to the aims of its founders and is able to provide bursary assistance to children, including orphans of Freeman of the City of London, according to need.

The School's aims are:

- to provide an education of the highest quality in which each individual can reach his or her academic potential;
- to provide a 'whole person' education in which the academic, creative, physical, social and spiritual development of each pupil is promoted in a genuinely co-educational environment;
- to foster an atmosphere of self-respect and care for others in which pupils are confident, fulfilled and happy;
- to prepare pupils to identify and fulfil their role in society and to provide an education for life;
- to work in partnership with parents, governors, staff and former pupils to achieve the School's aims.

ADMISSIONS PROCESS

Registration

The first stage in the admissions process is registration. Formal consideration cannot be given to any applicant unless they are registered with the school. Parents register their children by completing and submitting a Registration Form (downloadable from our website) with the registration fee of £85. (Please note, the registration fee will be £100 from 1st January 2012)

The normal registration cycle is shown on the schedule opposite.

Entry

Entry is normally in September. Pupils are occasionally admitted in January, if places are available. Parents should contact the Admissions Office if January entry is under consideration.

Entrance Criteria

Applicants must meet the entrance criteria appropriate to the year of entry. The City of London Freeman's School is an academically selective school and applications are considered on the basis of written tests, school reports, interviews and performance in public or other examinations (eg Common Entrance Examinations or GCSE). Where there are more applicants than places available the School will consider all of the above in reaching a decision. The schedule opposite sets out the requirements at each entry point.

The Offer of a Place

No offer will be made until a report has been received from the applicant's current school. This report will be considered alongside the results of any tests and/or interviews.

Some offers of places will be conditional on performance in public examinations. The acceptance of an offer for a day place will require payment of a £1000 deposit. From the deposit £500 will be held by the School until the final account is due and will not earn interest. The remaining £500 will be offset against the first term's fees. The acceptance of an offer for a boarding place will require a deposit of a full term's fees, of which £1000 will be held by the School until the final account is due, and will not earn interest. The remainder will be offset against the first term's fees. The deposit will be returned only where an applicant does not meet the conditions of an offer made and that offer is subsequently withdrawn.

Acceptance of an offer also commits parents to payment of the first term's fees, except where the offer is withdrawn because an applicant does not meet the conditions of the offer (eg Common Entrance Examinations or GCSE). Where the applicant withdraws after an offer has been accepted, the first term's fees are still payable, unless the School can fill the place by a replacement pupil.

In cases where the number of applicants exceeds the number of available places the School may invite parents to put their child's name on a waiting list.

SCHOLARSHIPS AND AWARDS

The City of London continues to support Scholarship awards for pupils at the School. These awards are intended to attract and reward pupils of high academic ability and talent.

Academic Awards

8+ (entry into Upper 2/Year 5)

- Eligibility** Freeman's pupils in Lower 2 (Year 4).
- Awards** Up to five Book Awards and a commemorative shield.
- When** Awards will be made in the first half of the summer term in which the pupil is in Lower 2 (Year 4).
- Criteria** The book awards are given to the top pupils in the year.
- Application** No separate application.



11+ (entry into Upper 3/Year 7)

- Eligibility** Freeman's pupils in Lower 3 (Year 6); pupils sitting entrance tests in January 2012 for Upper 3 (Year 7) from other schools.
- Awards** Up to three Scholarship awards of not more than 50% of the tuition fee; tenable for seven years.
- When** Awards will be made following the entrance examinations for 11+ entry in January of Lower 3 (Year 6).
- Criteria** Performance in the entrance tests (only taken by Freeman's pupils applying for a scholarship); interview; written report by the Head of the Junior/Preparatory School covering academic excellence and potential; attitude to work; wider contribution to the School.
- Application** In the autumn term of Lower 3 (Year 6). A letter from the Head of Junior School about awards and the application process will be sent to parents of Lower 3 (Year 6) pupils at Freeman's. External applicants who are sitting the entrance tests are automatically considered for awards and there is no separate application for Academic Scholarships.

Deadline for applications is Friday 16th December 2011.

SCHOLARSHIPS AND AWARDS

13+ (entry into Upper 4/Year 9)

- Eligibility** Freeman's pupils in Lower 4 (Year 8); pupils joining Upper 4 (Year 9) from other schools.
- Awards** Up to five Scholarship awards of not more than 50% of the tuition fee; tenable for five years.
- When** Awards will be made following the scholarship examinations taken in March of Lower 4 (Year 8).
- Criteria** Performance in the scholarship examinations; interview; written report by the Head of the Junior/Preparatory School covering academic excellence and potential; attitude to work; wider contribution to the School.
- Application** Autumn term or early in the spring term of Lower 4 (Year 8). A letter from the Head of Junior School about the awards and the application process will be sent to parents of Lower 4 (Year 8) pupils at Freeman's and to candidates from other schools who have accepted conditional places in the autumn term.

Deadline for applications is Friday 3rd February 2012.



16+ (entry into the Sixth Form)

- Eligibility** Freeman's pupils in Upper 5; pupils applying for Lower 6 from other schools.
- Awards** Up to ten Scholarship awards of not more than 50% of the tuition fee; tenable for two years.
- When** Awards will be made following the scholarship examinations in November of Upper 5 (Year 11).
- Criteria** Performance in the scholarship examinations; interview; written report by the Head of the applicants school or Head of the Upper School covering: academic excellence and potential; predicted GCSE grades; attitude to work; wider contribution to the School.
- Application** Early in the autumn term of Upper 5 (Year 11), a letter from the Headmaster about the awards and the application process will be sent to parents of Upper 5 (Year 11) pupils at Freeman's and to registered applicants from other schools.

Deadline for applications is Friday 14th October 2011.

SCHOLARSHIPS AND AWARDS

Music Awards

11+ (entry into Upper 3/Year7)

Eligibility Freeman's pupils in Lower 3 (Year 6); pupils sitting entrance tests in January 2012 for Upper 3 (Year 7) from other schools. Applicants must have reached Grade 3 in one instrument and be able to offer a second study/voice.

Awards Up to two Music Scholarship awards of not more than 25% of the tuition fee, and free tuition in one instrument; tenable for seven years.

When Awards will be made following the entrance examinations for 11+ entry in January of Lower 3 (Year 6).

Criteria Audition and interview with the Director of Music.

Application At the start of the spring term of Lower 3 (Year 6). A letter from the Director of Music about the awards and the application process will be sent to parents of Lower 3 pupils at CLFS and to registered applicants from other schools at the end of the term before.

Deadline for applications is Friday 16th December 2011.



13+ (entry into Upper 4/Year 9)

Eligibility Freeman's pupils in Lower 4 (Year 8); pupils joining Upper 4 (Year 9) from other schools. Applicants must have reached Grade 5 in one instrument and be able to offer a second study/voice.

Awards Up to two Music Scholarship awards of not more than 50% of the tuition fee and free tuition in one instrument; tenable for five years.

When Awards will be made following the scholarship examinations taken in February/March of Lower 4 (Year 8).

Criteria Audition and interview with the Director of Music.

Application Autumn term or early in the spring term of Lower 4 (Year 8). A letter from the Director of Music about the awards and the application process will be sent to parents of Lower 4 pupils at CLFS and to candidates from other schools who have accepted places at the end of the autumn term.

Deadline for applications is Friday 27th January 2012.

SCHOLARSHIPS AND AWARDS

16+ (entry into the Sixth Form)

- Eligibility** Freeman's pupils in Upper 5 (Year 11); pupils applying for Lower 6 from other schools. Applicants must have reached Grade 7 in one instrument and be able to offer a second study/voice.
- Awards** Up to two Music Scholarship awards of not more than 50% of the tuition fee and free tuition in one instrument; tenable for two years.
- When** Awards will normally be made following the Scholarship examinations in October/November of Upper 5 (Year 11).
- Criteria** Audition and interview with the Director of Music.
- Application** Normally, early in the autumn term of Upper 5 (Year 11). A letter from the Director of Music about the awards and the application process will be sent to parents of Upper 5 pupils at Freeman's and to registered applicants from other schools early in the autumn term.
- Deadline for applications is Friday 14th October 2011.**



All-Rounder Awards

Whilst the School does not offer specific awards for excellence outside the above areas, consideration will be given to excellence in other areas, eg drama, art or sport, in addition to academic excellence. Both the application form and the reports requested from the Heads of Schools will provide the opportunity for candidates to demonstrate achievements in one or more of the above areas.

All Scholarships and Awards will be reviewed annually in light of the recipients' attitude, effort and behaviour. It is a condition of all Awards at Freeman's that pupils and their parents are supportive of the School's policies and procedures.

The names of pupils awarded Scholarship and Exhibitions will be listed in the 'The School Year' published on Prize Day in the same year as the awards are made.

By Road

From the M25, exit at Junction 9 (East or West). Follow the signs for Leatherhead & Dorking (A24). At the roundabout at the top of the hill, follow the signs for Ashted (first exit). Go through Ashted Village and towards the end of The Street turn right into Park Lane.

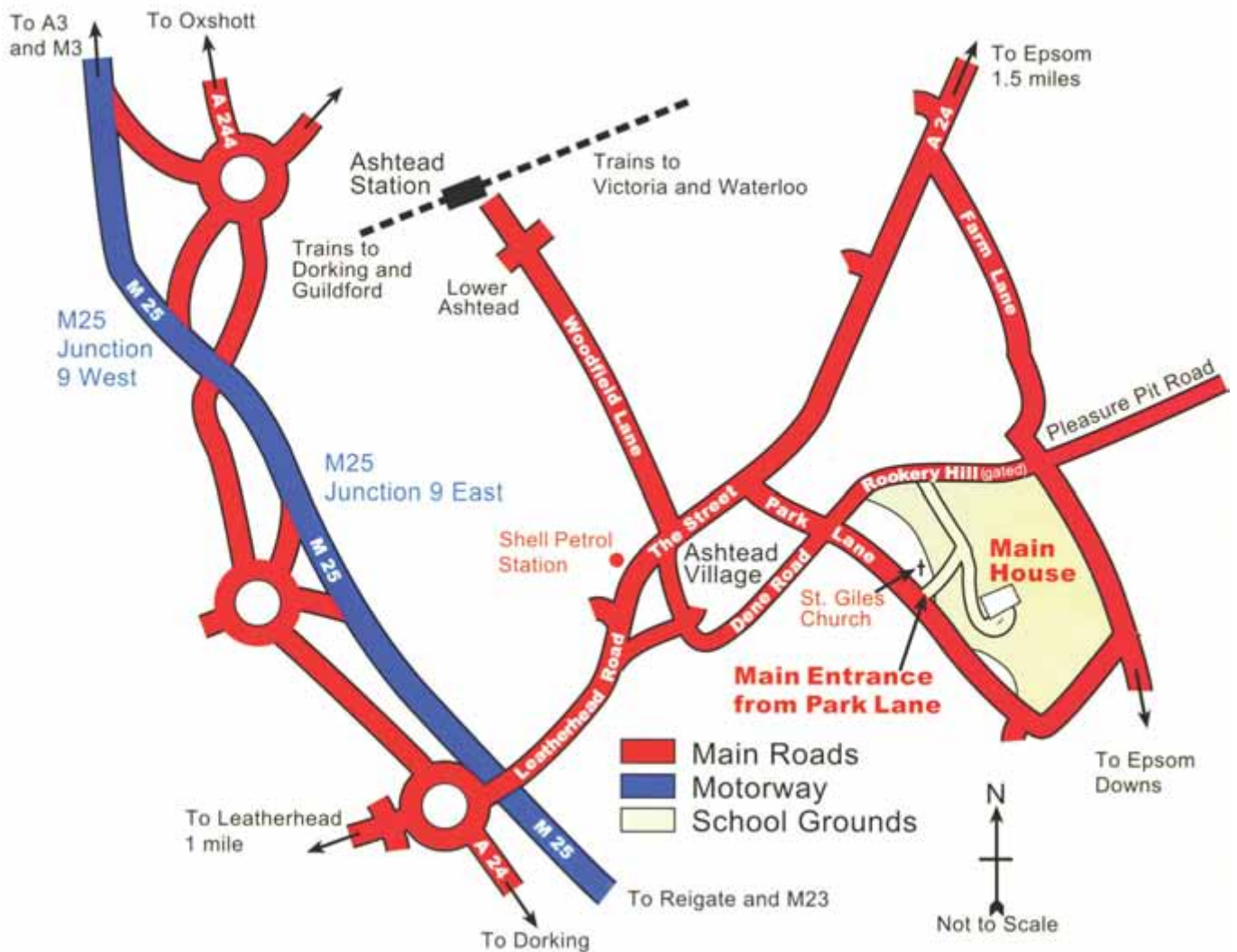
From Dorking or Esher, go to the Dorking/Leatherhead/M25 roundabout and follow the signs for Ashted. Then follow the directions above.

From Epsom, follow the A24 Leatherhead Road. As you enter Ashted turn left into Park Lane.

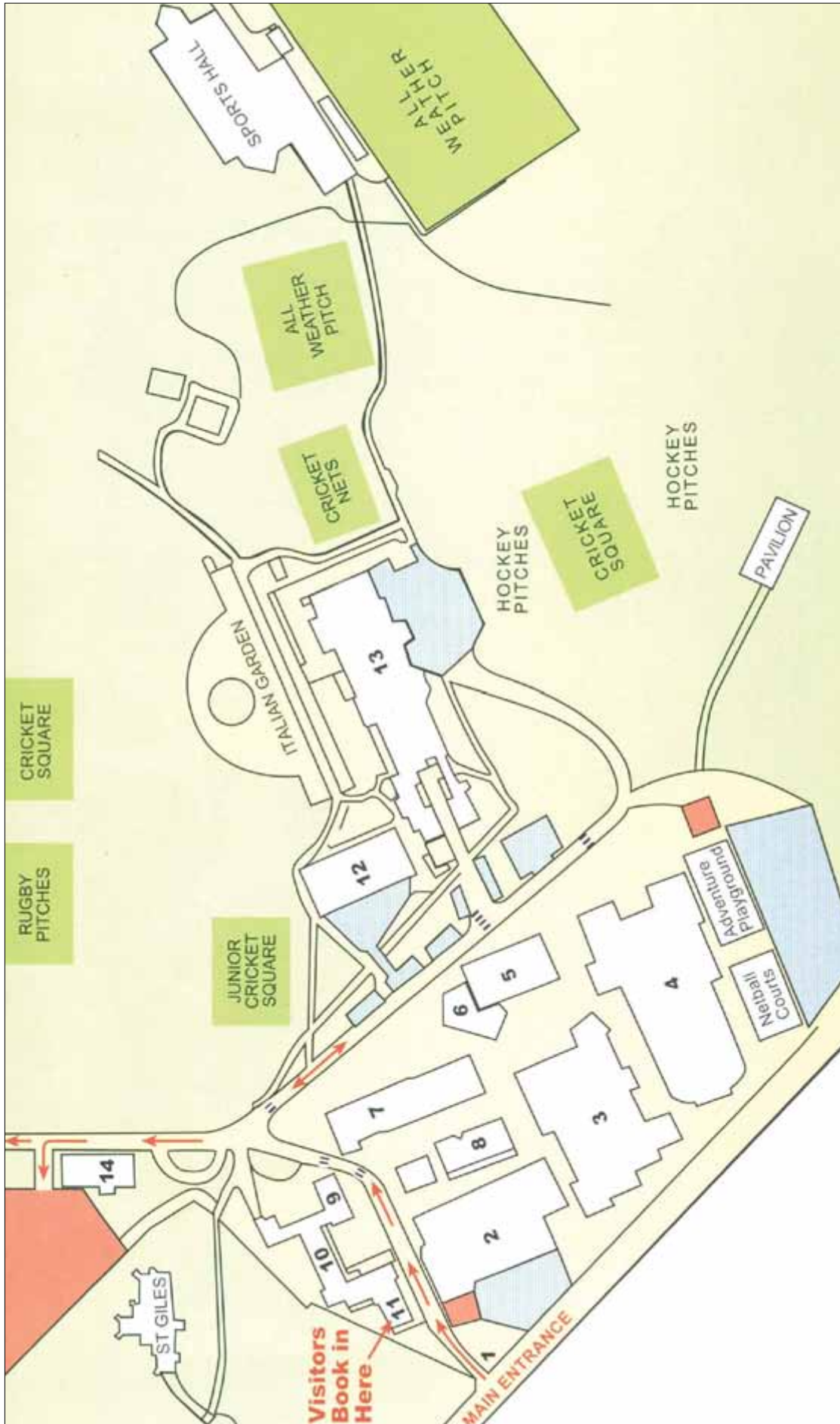
On entering the School, park in a visitor's space on the right and report to the Gatehouse on the left. If the Gatehouse is closed (ie outside normal hours) proceed through the grounds, turn right, pass the Ferndale Theatre and use the Visitors' Parking by the Adventure Playground.
