

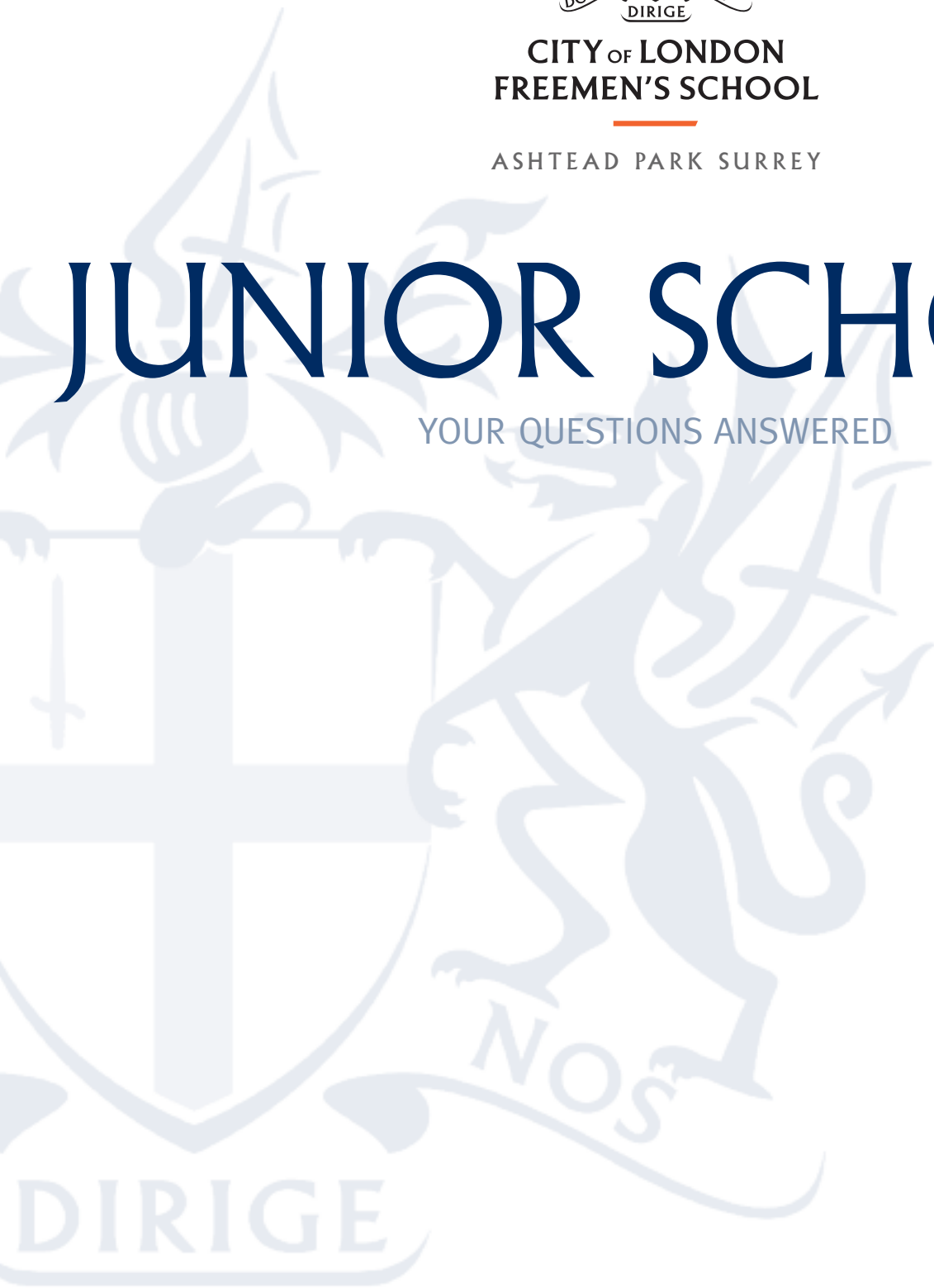

WHICH SUBJECTS DO YOU OFFER?

At Key Stage 2 the curriculum is largely National Curriculum based, although without the rigid restraints placed upon maintained schools. We strive to develop skills in a wide range of areas.

In the Junior School, Music, PE, and Modern Languages are taught by specialist teachers. However in Years 7 and 8 (Key

Stage 3) pupils are taught by subject specialists, mainly from the Senior School. In Art, Music, Science, Food Technology, and Information and Communication Technology Key Stage 3 pupils are taught in specialist rooms based in the Senior School. By working in the Senior School environment the pupils have access to superb resources.
